2012 YEAR IN REVIEW

This is my first year as President and I would like to thank Stephen Lamy and all the Directors for their support. It has been another hectic year for the CLA. During 2012 Rick Porter (1) resigned as Director. Rick joined the board in February 2004 and had served as the chair of our publications committee. The CLA would like to thank Rick for all the excellent work he has undertaken on our behalf as a Director. We also welcome Farid Assaf from Banco Chambers, who was appointed as a Director during September.

The Equity & Contract Conference, held in conjunction with the Journal of Equity, was most successful. Speakers included Justice James Edelman, Hon Kevin Lindgren QC, Professor Elisabeth Peden and Professor Michael Bryan. We'd like to especially thank Associate Professor Simone Degeling (4 pictured with Cristean Yazbeck) for her assistance in organising the event and Jonathon Casson (3) from Holman Webb for sponsorship.

Due to the positive response we received from members to our 2011 inaugural CLA Mandatory CLE seminar for Practitioners, we once again offered a program in conjunction with Notre Dame University Australia. Professor Gerard Ryan was the chair with speakers including Associate Professor Sandra Lynch and Karen Rowe-Nurse, all from Notre Dame, along with Peter Punch and Janine Smith from Carroll & O'Dea.

We were also delighted to be able to offer two special annual lunchtime seminars — Jeffrey Goldberger with his contract cases review in February and Russell Miller AM with his March update on Australian Consumer Law.

NEW GRADUATES PROGRAM
